### Prof. M. V. Mathur

Prof. Mathur was the founder Chairman of IDS Jaipur from 1981 to 1987. He was the country's leading economist and academician, widely recognized for his professional and academic achievements. He was the Vice-Chancellor (1966-68) of the University of Rajasthan. He also worked as a member of various Commissions and Committees at International, National, and State levels. He was the recipient of numerous awards, including Best Teacher, Parikh Memorial, Rajasthan Ratna, and Rajasthan University's 'Scroll of Honour' for Economics, Public Administration, and Education, among others. In 1989, he was conferred 'Padma Bhushan' by the Government of India. He authored several books, including "Planning, Panchayati Raj, and Democracy."



### Speaker: Shri V. Srinivas, Secretary to Government of India

Shri V. Srinivas serves as Secretary to the Government of India, Department of Administrative Reforms and Public Grievances and Department of Pension and Pensioners Welfare in the Ministry of Personnel, Public Grievances and Pensions. Mr. V. Srinivas holds additional charge of Director General of the National Centre for Good Governance. He represents India on the Council of Administration of the International Institute of Administrative Sciences, Brussels, since 2018. He is a recipient of the Digital India Award 2020 for implementing e-Office in the Central Secretariat. He has authored three books, published over 250 papers, and delivered over 100 orations. He is a senior administrator, a respected academician, and an institution builder par excellence.

### Synopsis

India's governance model in recent years has undergone radical reforms. Technology has brought government and citizens closer and has become a powerful tool to empower citizens and a medium to optimize transparency and accountability in day-to-day functioning. India has successfully created some of the world's best digital platforms for improving service delivery, effective redressal of public grievances, and digital central secretariat, and developed a robust model for recognizing meritocracy, benchmarking governance, and e-services. In the Amrit Kaal period, India has firmly moved toward the digital empowerment of citizens and the digital transformation of institutions. The adoption of e-governance practices best symbolizes New India's strong institutions. The best manifestation of the "Maximum Governance - Minimum Government" policy is a "Digitally Empowered Citizen" and a "Digitally Transformed Institution".
